Mosaic has been on an amazing journey since 1992 when it was established as the Gosnells-Armadale Community Living Association by three Perth families who wanted more options and opportunities for loved ones living with disability.

In 30 years, Mosaic has grown to a 260+ team, working across more than 20 locations. We are proud to have responded with agility and resilience to the many significant changes we have seen over the past 30 years, while always remaining true to our Purpose and our Values.

I became involved about halfway through Mosaic's journey and have in that time witnessed many changes and challenges. We have moved from block funding to individualised funding and adjusted to the introduction of the NDIS and increased regulatory and compliance requirements. Mosaic has embraced improved service delivery models and increased our service offerings to be able to support more people. We have also adapted to the Disability Sector moving from a collegiate to a competitive environment.

Successive Mosaic Boards and Executive Teams have continually ensured that our focus on family and community underpins everything we do. Through sound governance and management Mosaic continues to be financially sustainable enabling us to invest in our people and systems and allowing us to create opportunities and transform lives.

At Mosaic, we focus on the possibilities that matter to people with disability. We are extremely grateful to every one of those people and their families who have entrusted us with their hopes, goals and dreams over the last 30 years. It continues to be our great honour to provide disability support services that give people and their families more choice, control and independence.

On 18 August 1992, the Gosnells-Armadale Community Living Association (GACLA) was incorporated.

This same year Peter, our first client, moved into his own home in Gosnells.

Our first Coordinator. Irene Diamondaris. was appointed on a part time basis.



11 clients, 22 staff

Our office was relocated to Lotteries House Armadale.



2000 GACLA's first Strategic Planning Day was held, and we commenced a new service, Family Supports, to complement our Accommodation Support service.



Mosaic appointed its first CEO, Trish Thomson-Harry, who was initially engaged for 20 hours per week to lead the ongoing development of Mosaic's services.



Mosaic welcomed Jeffrey St John as Patron of the organisation.



59 clients, 79 staff

Mosaic grew significantly, supporting 33 clients in 8 residential homes, and supporting another 26 clients in the community.



We updated our logo to better reflect the many and diverse people supported by Mosaic.



Mosaic re-branded with a new logo which better represented our all-encompassing support for people with disability.



Rae House in Safety Bay was opened.



We celebrated Mosaic's 25th Anniversary with a gala event at Government House Ballroom.



Three new houses are opened – Grace House and Harrisdale 1 & 2.



Our Growth

Sowing the seeds...

In 1991 Heidi Scantlebury and Gillian Mannell, 2 Local Area Coordinators from the Disability Services Commission successfully applied for funding that would enable one young man living with disability to receive 24-hour support in his own home. Because the funds had to be administered by an Incorporated Association, Heidi and Gillian called a meeting in September 1991 and invited parents of persons who had an intellectual disability to attend this meeting... which ultimately led to the creation of what we now call Mosaic.

GACLA moved to rented office facilities in Royal Street, Kenwick, supported by a grant from Lottery West.

We gained our first office – a single shared room in a Thornlie house.

We moved from Lotteries House to 10 Forrest Road Armadale, and our name was changed to Mosaic Family Support Services. Suggested by Board Member Lorraine deLacv. it was thought to be more reflective of the many people who make up the whole of Mosaic.



Our first Patron. Jane Gerrick, was appointed





We commenced the Transitional Accommodation Support Service program, supporting people with disability who were exiting the justice system.



We changed our name to Mosaic Community Care and moved into larger premises in O'Connor.



We also purchased our first property. The Baldivis home was named Dawson House in memory of Peter Dawson, whom Mosaic had supported.



We opened a sub-office in the Rockingham Lotteries House due to a growing demand for services in the area.






Lorraine deLacy was awarded Mosaic's first Life Membership.

Our 21st home, Silas House is opened and we are proudly celebrating our 30th Anniversary.

Therapy services was launched, including Occupational Therapy, Speech Pathology and Physiotherapy.



Mosaic was audited for the first time under the NDIS Quality and Safeguards Commission and successfully met all performance indicators.
